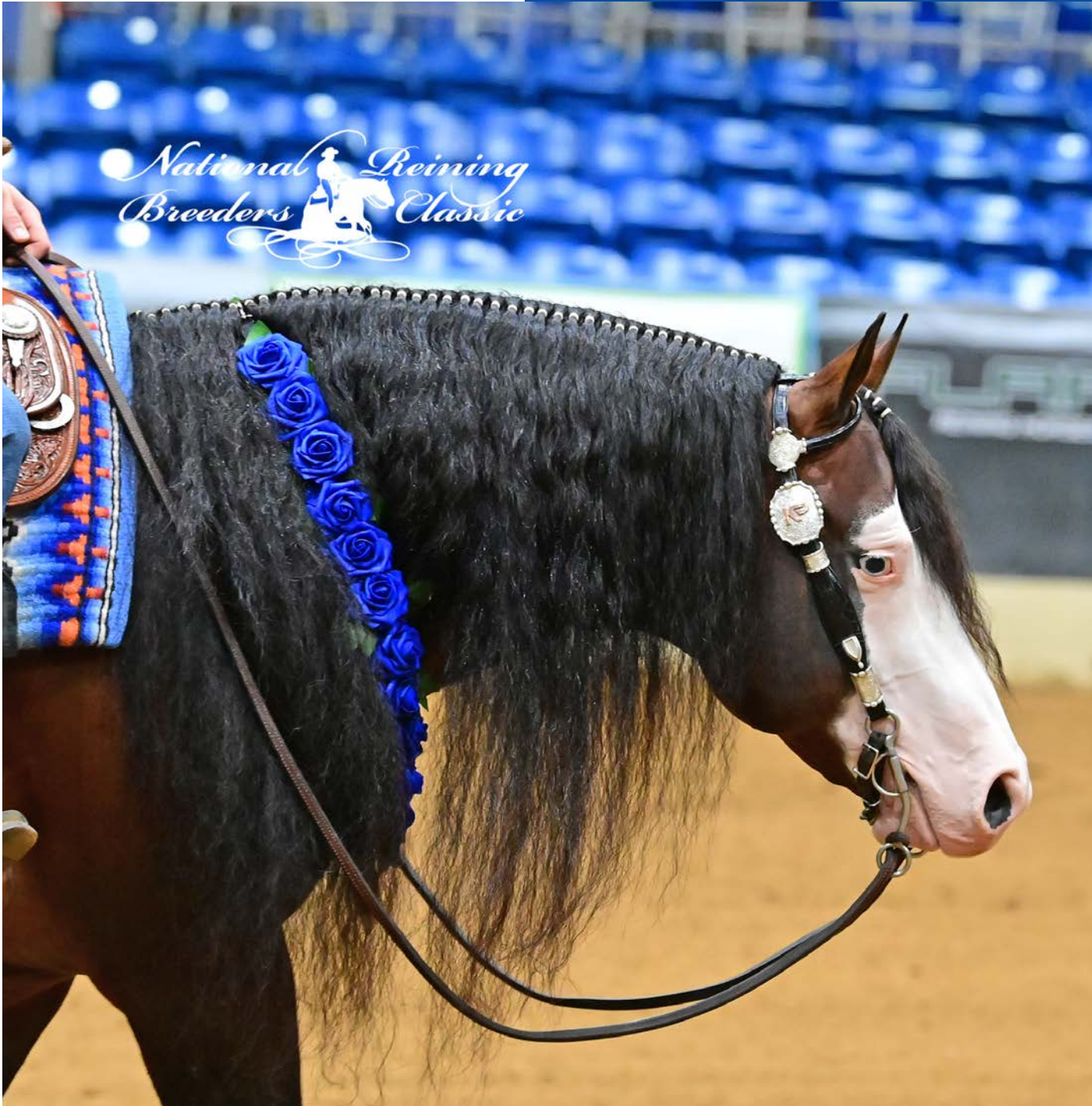

Kole Price & Golden Coins

Open Classic Level 4 Champion

Collectin' their show coins, Kole Price and Golden Coins scored a 227.5 to secure their win in the 2025 NRBC Open Level 4 Finals.

"When you start off at a show like this, so well, you just want to keep it up. Everybody else says don't change nothing but they are all gonna bring it at the finals. He's that incredible horse you dream about every night and you just can't wait to go out and ride him," Price said.

Goldens Coins is owned by Coin Toss LLC and was bred by Silver Spurs Equine. The 2020 stallion is sired by Spooks Gotta Gun and out of Electric Cha Ching.

Golden Coins will be taking a much deserved break and then start getting ready for the NRHA Derby and then on to The Run For A Million. Price wanted to thank all who have helped them win the prize.

"I want to thank the Coin Toss partners, the Roberts Family, and Kelsey. I want to thank my wife, she has been out there every night making sure everything is crisp and not letting any stone go unturned. Even getting up at 4 a.m. at home just watching me ride as an extra set of eyes and keeping everything sharp and not letting me get lazy. I owe a lot to my wife and I couldn't do it without her.



Marco Ricotta & Savage Love

Open Classic Level 3 Co-Champion

With a score of 222, Marco Ricotta and Savage Love tied for the Level 3 Open Co-Championship. A slight bobble in the preliminary round kept the pair out of Saturday's Level 4 finals, but they're still returning to Arizona with a big check to the tune of \$32,500!

"He is so sweet, and great minded. It doesn't matter where he is, he doesn't care (about other horses). Yesterday, he was great with his circles and his stops were strong. He has a lot of style, and he has the look," Ricotta shared.

Last year, the Ricotta's didn't come to Tulsa for the NRBC. "We skipped last year, so this year we made sure to come," he said. "We just came from the Cactus, so this horse is going to get some time off."

Savage Love, by SG Frozen Enterprize, is special to Marco and his wife Jenny. Jenny owns the dam, Miss Whizzletown, on whom she and Marco have won more than \$100,000. "There is a lot of pressure from my wife because she owns them," Ricotta joked. "This is special. So far, he's doing really great for me, and he's only five."

Following Savage Love's sabbatical from the arena, the pair will set their eyes on The Run For A Million in August.



Dany Tremblay & All Guns On Crush

Open Classic Level 3 Co- Champion

Competing as the second-to-last horse in the Level 4 Open Finals, All Guns On Crush, piloted by Dany Tremblay, marked a 222 to tie for the win of the Level 3. Not only that, but the seven-year-old gelding also placed in the Level 4 for total earnings of \$46,500.

“Of course I would have loved to do a little better in the Level 4, because this horse deserves it. I missed a stop, but it was my fault, not his. I can’t say anything against this horse,” Tremblay said.

Bred by Adh-Mor Ranch and now owned by Dany’s brother, Fred Tremblay, All Guns On Crush had earned more than \$176,000 prior to the win in Tulsa. By PS Mega Shine Chic out of All Guns On Deck, All Guns On Crush is special.

“He’s part of the family. We’ve had him for a long time and we’ve done a lot of shows together. He’s a great horse with a great personality. He’s the horse that qualified me for the Run For A Million,” Tremblay shared. “He doesn’t owe me anything, and I owe him everything.”

For Tremblay, success is a team effort, and he’s quick to give credit.

“The first person I thank is my brother. I have good days and bad days, but my brother is always there for me. He’s my number one fan, and I can’t thank him enough for helping me,” Tremblay said. “I also thank the team we have working for us. I had great help both here and at home. It’s amazing to be able to trust that things are being taken care of in both places.”



Sean McBurney & Addys Lil Dream

Open Classic Level 2 & Prime Time Champion



Addin to their dreams Sean McBurney and Addys Lil Dream won the NRBC Open Finals Level 2 and Open Prime Time Champion.

This 6-year-old-mare is sired by Magnum Chic Dream and out of Miss Lil Addy Tude, bred by Toyon Ranch LLC. The mare is currently owned by David Stroud.

“She’s just good every trip for me. I have a lot of confidence in her and we’ve had her and put more money on her here. She just gets better every time we go,” McBurney said.

His wife, Jordan McBurney and The Smoke Show, also had some success here at the NRBC when the team scored a 72.5 to Co-Cham-

pion the Novice Horse Open Level 2 and 3.

“We have some Gunnatrashya babies out of her this year. We have a colt and a filly so that’s exciting. Then we are flushing her with No Mans Whiskey,” Mr. McBurney said.

McBurney wanted to be sure to thank everyone who gave him the opportunity to show here at the NRBC.

“I obviously want to thank my wife, my daughter, Millie, Gustavo, and Terry and David Stroud are just super supportive and fun to show for them 100%. I also want to thank everyone who gives pointers and encouragement,” Mr. McBurney said.



Vanessa Strotmann & What A Surprise

Open Classic Level 1 Champion

By no surprise Vanessa Strotmann and What A Surprise won the NRBC Open Finals Level 1 Champion with a 217.

“He is just so nice to ride. He is the exact same in the pen as he is outside the pen or at home. Just very consistent and so good minded and a sweet horse to train on,” Strotmann said.

The 5-year-old stallion is sired by Walla Walla Whiz and out of Surpriseinadarkalley. Owned by Deer Creek Farms and bred by Story Book Stables.

“I tried not to warm him up to much because he is very tired. This is his fourth run of the week, because he showed in the Non Pro, made the finals, and then I showed him. He didn’t feel like he was shown four times. He just went in there and showed just like he did the first time and was just so easy,” Strotmann said.

Strotmann thanks all who have helped get her here to the NRBC.

“I want to thank the Honstetter team for giving me horses to show, Riley & Jim Horn, Julie Ridgeway, everyone is like a family and its a great team to be apart of,” Strotmann said.

"She was pretty good. I showed her smooth everywhere and tried to build some confidence before we go to the next horse show. I missed the finals by half a point. So I thought let's go show again," Mrs. McBurney said.

This 5-year-old mare was born and raised by Loren Booth and sold as a yearling to Rhodes River Ranch. After her success at the 2023 NRHA Futurity Loren Booth bought her back in December of her three-year-old-year. The Smoke Show is sired by Inferno Sixty Six and out of Starlights Sugarwhiz.

Makin' magic happen Casey Deary and Mr Abracadabra took home the buckle for the NRBC Ancillary Open High Point Champion.

The 2019 stallion, Mr Abracadabra, is owned by Justine Leedom, sired by Gunnatrashya and out of Nu Magic Cash. Misty Valley Performance Horses LLC. are the breeders of the stallion.

"I've had the horse going on two years. Luca showed him in The Run For A Million qualifier in Scottsdale, Arizona, and was in the exciting four-way run-off and then ended up second on him last year," Deary said.

Casey Deary described his run as a roller coaster ride.

"It was a roller coaster. There were some really really high, cool, and amazing things and some not so amazing things. That horse is such an athlete and with the things he does great usually outweigh the challenging parts," Deary said.

Casey wanted to thank his team for all of their help in preparing for this show and others.

"Obviously, none of this happens without a great staff in the office putting this horse show on. So I would like to thank that whole team of people. The schedule has been fantastic this year. I feel like we have all got some more sleep and the ground has been great where

we can go run and stop these horses with some confidence. And Nicole does the work of four people before and when we get here. So I certainly couldn't do it without her," Deary said.
